

Museums Contribute to Ontario's Economy, Employment, and Tourism

- Every year, there are more than 12 million visitors to Ontario's museums, art galleries, and historic sites.
- \$562 million of museums' expenses go towards day-to-day operations, including wages*
- 5.3 million, or 48% of Ontarians, visited a museum or art gallery in 2010*
- \$4.1 billion spent by arts and culture tourists, representing 36% of spending by all overnight tourists
- 67,700 jobs and \$2.4 billion in wages generated in Ontario by arts and culture tourists' spending
- Ontario's cultural sector directly contributes \$20 billion towards the province's GDP**
